**Exercise Planning for Healthcare Coalitions**

#### Section 1: What is a Scenario?

A scenario is an outline or a model of the simulated sequence of events for the exercise. It can be written as a narrative or depicted by an event timeline. For operations-based exercises, a scenario provides background information about the incident catalyst of the exercise. The scenario facilitates achievement of exercise capabilities, tasks, and objectives, which are the foundation of exercise design.

A scenario consists of three basic components:

- 1. General context or comprehensive story.
- 2. Required conditions that will allow players to demonstrate proficiency and competency in conducting critical tasks, demonstrating core capabilities, and meeting objectives.
- 3. Technical details necessary to accurately depict scenario conditions and events.

The purpose of this worksheet is to determine exercise scope by gathering:

- 1. Input from the exercise planning team.
- 2. Design requirements and conditions (e.g., assumptions and artificialities)
- 3. Scenario variables (major/minor events, impacts, etc.).

#### **Section 2: Steps for developing Scenario**

Determine the type of threat or hazard

Identify major and minor events within the type of threat/hazard

Link to plans, policies and procedures (why use this event to test a capability?)

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Type of Threat/Hazard: Hurricane

Major/Minor Events

Why use this to test capabilities?

The focus of this exercise scenario will be a hurricane that will be large enough to impact the entire state. This event will stress the core preparedness capabilities (HPP, PHEP, etc.) during the exercise. The State Emergency Operations Center as well as local emergency operations centers will be activated with participation from the 18 emergency support functions in Florida.

Major events are big problems resulting from the emergency. They should be likely events, based on case studies or operational plans that call for realistic action that could require multiple agency involvement.

Minor events happen internally in an agency and are usually day to day incidents (such as small hazardous spills) that do not require outside assistance.

A hurricane scenario presents challenges even if the storm does not directly impact the region, including surge of immediate medical needs of persons injured, continuous care of patients, change in healthcare facility procedures (degradation of care) due to inaccessible services and power failures, increased mental health needs for victims and responders, short-and long-term challenges with fresh water and safe food supplies, shelter vulnerability to diseases, etc. This scenario challenges an organization's preparedness plan, is realistic, and includes the joint ESF-8 and Healthcare Coalition objectives.

As the planning team, it is important to consider the concepts and objectives identified by the participating members of the Healthcare Coalition when choosing major and minor impacts on the following page. For your convenience, the provided spreadsheet captures all of the completed concept and objective worksheet data. Keep in mind what is realistic and plausible for your jurisdiction, for example it is unlikely to have a snow storm in Florida during the month of May, however it is reasonable for heavy rainfall throughout the month causing a rise in the surrounding water levels and subsequently flooding.

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Select the different impacts that should be included in the scenario and indicate if it is a Major or Minor event (if Minor, indicate the facility it will impact):
